

## **CAHPS**

The Consumer Assessment of Healthcare Providers and Systems (CAHPS) is a federally mandated survey used to gather patient feedback each year, focused on measuring health care experiences and outcomes.

Results from this survey provides important information about how consumers perceive their care and experiences with their providers and their health plans. Through continued collaboration and partnership, we can use this survey to improve health outcomes and experiences for your patients, our members.

## **CAHPS:** An overview

Who: A random sample of health plan members receive the CAHPS survey. Participation is voluntary.

When: March - June 2022

Why: The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) requires all Medicare Advantage plans to issue a CAHPS survey. It's administered by CMS and the National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA). Its purpose is to better understand overall health care experiences from the patient perspective. Health plans and providers use this information to make changes and implement programs that will enhance patient experiences with the care they receive.

4	Rating of Health Care	On a scale from 0 – 10, how would you rate your:  Overall health care? Personal doctor? Specialist seen most often?
4	Rating of Plan	Not related to health care provider
4	Rating of Drug Plan	Not related to health care provider
